Founded in 1977, Givens Pursley LLP is one of Idaho’s most respected full-service law firms. As part of the routine business, there is an ongoing need to generate an enormous amount of printed legal and supporting documents from their printers. In its quest for higher efficiency and greater savings, the team at Givens Pursley decided to put the new HP Officejet Enterprise Color X555 printer to test as the firm’s default printer to see if it delivered as promised. It did.

Designed for enterprise business, the new HP Officejet Enterprise color printer series attracted the interest of IT Director Patti Henderson of Givens Pursley LLP, who participated as an early adopter to put the technology through the paces.<sup>1</sup>

“The Officejet Enterprise Color X555 blew us away,” explains Henderson. “We printed multiple copies of 800-page water law and land-use PDFs with a combination of text, graphics and plat maps. We try to push the limits in our testing and couldn’t break it or make it run hot with our aggressive testing.”

## Ink in the enterprise

The earlier limitations typically associated with ink printers are now ancient history due to new HP innovations and design. For example, HP ink printers now support the low intervention and durability needs of business including serviceability, large capacity supplies, large capacity paper trays, and auto duplex. Technology breakthroughs in ink with HP PageWide Technology offer up to twice the printing speed at half the running cost of lasers.<sup>2</sup>

“We’re impressed with its reliability and performance, and even more with the wonderful quality of ink printing,” continues Henderson. “Our documents are a public facing product of our firm, and we want their quality to reflect our high standard of service. I’d put the color quality up against 600 dpi laser color any day.”

## Quiet speed wins the day

While Henderson was running the HP Officejet Enterprise Color X555 printer through its paces, she was surprised to find that it prints at up to 70 pages per minute in general office mode, up to twice as fast as in-class competitive printers. In addition, the large paper tray capacity and scanner option, available with the X585 model, make this new technology very practical for the firms’ needs.

“The large tray, over time, saves a lot of extraneous paper-refilling work. Less repeated refilling also reduces the possibility to bend or break tray guides with heavy use,” she adds. “This printer is perfect for a midrange, mid-capacity workgroup machine and its support of advanced MFP workflow solutions provides an additional path to maximize efficiency and integrate with our business practices.”

Henderson also notes the technological evolution of ink technology. “Due to the historical limitations of ink printers in the office, a few years ago I wouldn’t have looked at ink as an enterprise printer even if someone asked me,” she concludes. “But the Officejet Enterprise X printers provide an amazing option. These new HP PageWide Technology innovations are highly competitive and a better choice in many scenarios. I like how quiet it is in the office—and the remarkable speed.”
